"VOICES OF ISAIAH"

In October, the Isaiah family will gather together in prayer and fellowship for our 50th High Holiday Season and the start of our jubilee year. It is a time to reflect on our past and look forward to the future. We welcome the first voice of what we hope will be the many "Voices of Isaiah." Jonathan Wagner shares his personal journey to the door of our synagogue and a special Shehecheyanu moment.

When I first moved to Great Neck in February 2004, I was simply looking for a temple to join for the High Holidays and wasn't thinking much about the rest of the year. I soon found Temple Isaiah online, and when I later arrived for the first time at 2 Stoner Avenue, I wondered if I was in the right place -- both physically and spiritually -- after Cathy Reibstein showed me the spot where Temple Isaiah's services took place in a Korean church, led by Temple Isaiah's Japanese rabbi, our beloved Rabbi Ted Tsuruoka (Of Blessed Memory).

When I relayed that experience to my father and grandmother, they each half-jokingly said something to the effect of: "You better make sure that place is legit!" Yet they were quickly put at ease when I sent them the very nice articles I found online about Rabbi Ted and his remarkable journey which led him to Temple Isaiah. They were even more assured after I told them about the first service I attended at Temple Isaiah, when I was warmly greeted by several congregants before listening intently as Rabbi Ted's sermon struck a chord with me. I suddenly thought, "This could definitely be my rabbi, and this could be my temple." I happily joined Temple Isaiah in October 2007, and was presented with a Certificate of Membership, which I proudly have on my bedroom wall.

Since then, I have gladly become far more involved with Temple Isaiah than I ever thought I would be. I've joined the temple choir, the board and several different committees, have co-led Shabbat services and helped build sukkahs. I became a regular Hatzilu food deliverer (along with our co-president Bill Rosenberg) and have posted bazaar and open house advertisements all around town. I even became a bar mitzvah all over again (30 years after the first time) and developed a loving relationship with Marsha after she saw one of the flyers I posted and we met at a Temple Isaiah open house.

Today, the end of my week simply doesn't feel right if I don't conclude it with a spiritually enriching Shabbat service in Temple Isaiah's warm and friendly sanctuary, followed by an inspiring Torah study session on a Saturday morning.

So much for seeking a temple "simply for the High Holidays." As we enter our special jubilee (50th) year this fall, I'm eager to see all of the new ways in which Temple Isaiah will continue to help me grow both as a Jew and as a person, and to discover more ways I can give back to a temple family which has already given so much to me.

THE CARING CIRCLE COMMITTEE IS READY TO HELP YOU AND YOUR FAMILY

There are times in our lives when we need and welcome helping hands. Once, extended families were close by to offer support. Today, many of us are geographically distant from relatives, and have a limited support network. In addition, our busy lives and outside commitments do not always foster close relationships with neighbors and a sense of community. It is an important part of Jewish tradition to care for one another through mutual responsibility and acts of loving-kindness (Gemilut Chasadim).

Temple Isaiah's Caring Circle Committee is available to reach out to members in time of need. We offer care and support to members and their families who are ill, homebound, or have experienced a recent loss. Depending upon the specific needs, the following services may be provided:

- Good Shabbos calls to homebound members
- Home visits and calls to ill and homebound members
- Transportation to Shabbat services and other services or programs (depending on availability)
- Help setting up a home for shiva (contact the office re "Setting Up A Shiva House" checklist)
 - Clergy/member-led minyan
 - Prayer books and kippot
 - Provide a meal after the shiva period (ask about kashrut and medical requirements)
 - Planting a tree in Israel in memory of a member of the congregation or family member

Additionally, if needed, the temple may provide the following items in setting up a home for shiva:

- Chairs
- Coat rack with hangers
- Large coffee urns
