RABBI'S COLUMN

Just days ago, we commemorated Tisha B'Av, the Ninth of the Hebrew month of Av, considered the saddest day of the Jewish year. It is the day that we remember the destruction of the Temples in Jerusalem, among other tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people, and yet, the moment that the sun goes down at the end of Tisha B'Av, a feeling of lightness and peacefulness comes over us and the words of the Prophet Isaiah, "Nachamu, Nachamu Ami – Be comforted, be comforted my people" herald in a time of contentment and healing.

This is the perfect leadup to the Hebrew month of Elul which falls just days (at least this year) into the month of August. Elul is a month of reflection, **renewal**, **re-entering** and change, for in just a few weeks we celebrate the Birthday of the World, Rosh HaShanah and shortly thereafter, Yom Kippur.

This year's High Holy Days will add to the change. It is our hope that we will **re-enter** our sanctuary fully so that we can worship together, but it will be done in hybrid fashion, meaning that it is our intention for our services to be live and in person, but we will also broadcast them so those who are not able to join us in the temple, for whatever reason, will be able to join in as we pray together.

This year we will welcome to our bimah, Cantorial student **Lori Weber** who is an advanced placement student at AJR and has been leading services professionally for many years. She enjoys when we all sing along together and I believe that you will all enjoy her style. Lori led services with me last Friday and I hope we all felt the joy of Shabbat. Lori will also join us during the month of August so that she can be formally introduced, and we can all learn some High Holy Day music. I can't wait to pray and sing together as we bring in 5782.

Wishing you a meaningful Elul and a restful summer.

Book.


The purchase of tickets for friends and extended family are always available too.


We look forward to being together in the sanctuary this year, to pray, meditate and greet each other in person.
