IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE RABBI:

Hello Temple Isaiah of Great Neck family and friends,

The High Holy Days are drawing near and as you finalize your plans, we wanted to update you with some information about our upcoming services.

As of today, we are anticipating that we will have a **hybrid format** for our services, meaning that **we will be allowing a limited number of worshipers into our building** for in-person services, **in addition to live streaming our services** directly to our website (**links and passwords to be sent out in a separate email**). Please note that these live streams will not be interactive as they were on the Zoom platform, but rather, they will be of a higher quality of sound, picture, and video production, which were not available on Zoom, and there will be a chat function available for your comments. Our new live stream platform will be much easier to connect to than zoom and will be based directly on the temple website. **Everyone who would like to join our services in person will have to register beforehand with our office, wear a mask and show a copy of the vaccination card at the door. Unfortunately, we cannot allow unvaccinated people to join in our in-person services.**

Ticket order forms for both virtual and in-house tickets have been mailed out and we would appreciate a timely response. No one will be admitted to services without an order form on file.

Prayer books for the High Holy Days will be available in digital form [Click for digital Prayerbook](#) or may be borrowed from the temple. Pick up dates for the prayerbooks will be announced soon. If you are unable to pick up books, we may be able to provide local delivery. Please contact us in the office via email at Isaiahgn@yahoo.com if you need a physical prayerbook and to register for both in-person and online services.

Both Cantorial Soloist Lori Weber and I, along with our temple leadership look forward to seeing you soon (either in the temple or online) and wish you and those you love a Shanah Tovah U'metukah, a Happy and Sweet New Year.
