The opposite of good is not evil, the opposite of good is indifference.

- Abraham Joshua Heschel

As I write this article, I am reminded that we have entered the three-week period just before Tisha B'Av (the 9th day of Av) that begins with Tzom Tammuz, the Fast of the Hebrew month of Tammuz, which commemorates the time when the Romans breached the outer wall of Jerusalem in the time of the Second Temple. This is a time of deep reflection and remembering. Looking into our hearts and finding new meaning in the history of our people. It also is a precursor to the High Holy Day season as we relive many of the saddest moments in Jewish history.

The Jewish holy day of Tisha B'Av, commemorates the destruction of the temple(s) and other misfortunes that have befallen Jewish people. This year, we add to the list, the October 7th terror attacks and by extension, it is also a time for marking pain and loss in our personal lives and the brokenness clearly present in our world today.

Our Sages believe these misfortunes were caused by something that is known as **sinat chinam – or baseless hated** and is countered by what can be described as **ahavat chinam – boundless love** (my paraphrasing), and on a very basic level, in the times when our rabbis wrote this, it made sense for them. We seek the opposite of hatred and call it love, and thus, it is this boundless love that can change the world, but now we understand more about baseless hatred and its roots. At the time it was a good analogy, but as Rabbi Heschel teaches, first we must care enough to make a change, and this is where his words come into play. This baseless hatred can be called evil, and rightly so. We have seen it on our televisions, our computers, spewing from the mouths of political leaders, and even in the halls of our most sacred political institutions, and it is not only happening in America. This happens throughout the world and sadly, in the land the Jewish people call their home. For this reason, Tisha B'Av takes on new meaning in 5784.

This year during Tisha B'Av, having witnessed **sinat chinam** on a massive level, it is time for us to do the opposite, but what is that? According to Professor Heschel, it is not allowing this hatred to fester. Not allowing our leaders to spew words of hatred using them as weapons to garner votes. Not standing by idly, hoping that it will all go away. We cannot be indifferent in the face of baseless hatred. We do not have the luxury of not caring, and we must care enough to stand up to this animosity. We must make sure our leaders know where we stand, and we must fight this hatred, not (only) with love, but with our feet, like Rabbi Heschel did in the Selma to Montgomery march in 1965. He said:

"For many of us the march from Selma to Montgomery was about protest and prayer. Legs are not lips and walking is not kneeling. And yet our legs uttered songs. Even without words, our march was worship. I felt my legs were praying."

Rabbi Heschel was not indifferent, and we must not be either. Whether in our country, or how we support the State of Israel. Our words and our prayers must be heard.

We invite you to join us on Monday, August 12 at 7:30 p.m. at Temple Beth-El for a solemn and spiritually powerful service commemorating Tisha B'Av. Join me and my colleagues, Rabbis Stoller and Brumer from Temple Beth El as we chant from the Book of Lamentations, retell the stories of destruction and the redemption that follows. Join with us in song, poetry and prayers of hope as we remember, and turn these prayers into action.



Our first book will be **The Wolf Hunt** by Ayelet Gundar- Goshen, an Israeli author and psychologist who also wrote **Waking Lions**, which was one of our groups favorite previous books.


