

Congregants of the Month

20 years ago, mindful of the spiritual needs of the Jewish residents of the Atria, the assisted living facility across the street from Temple Isaiah, and of the difficulty the residents had in joining us for Shabbat Services, our then Rabbi Tsurouka zl, began holding services there. Shortly after that, Belle and Elliott Gayer began alternating with the Rabbi and then 15 years ago took over the weekly services and added holiday services and celebrations as well. The Gayers make the holidays extra special by treating the residents to homemade latkes on Chanukkah, Hamentashen on Purim, a Passover Seder, and homemade blintzes on Shavuot! They also hold Yizkor services as appropriate. The Jewish residents look forward to Belle and Elliott's presence each week, and we at Temple Isaiah say Yasher Koach for their generosity in taking on this mitzvah.







I am writing this message a few days after we celebrated Pride Shabbat, and continue to celebrate Pride Month in our nation, community and synagogue. It is also just days before I begin my summer High Holy Day prep, and some vacation too, so it is exceedingly important to take heed of what the message for our Pride Shabbat taught us. (Hint: it is much more than just Pride)

Usually, we would have a speaker that talks about the positive accomplishments that the LGBTQ community has attained, and rightly so, but this year, our speaker Steven Goldstein, saw the movement through a completely different lens. In his speech last Friday evening, he lambasted the leadership of these LGBTQ advocacy groups because of the stand they took on the State of Israel, which espoused anti-Israel rhetoric and often bordered (or went directly) onto antisemitic hate speech.

Goldstein began with this statement:

Since June 1999, I have spoken at 42 LGBTQ Pride Shabbat services in the United States and Israel. This year, for the first time, I've hesitated to accept invitations. My pride in the leadership of my LGBTQ community is at the lowest point of my life. Antisemitism is spreading like a Stage 4 cancer throughout the LGBTQ community, and many LGBTQ leaders are causing it or condoning it through their silence. This is not a year for celebration. This is a year for condemnation. This is quite a statement from someone who "founded and led Garden State Equality [for 10 years] and helped build it into a powerhouse that passed more than 200 laws for LGBTQ equality, including marriage equality, transgender equality and the country's strongest state law against school bullying."

Goldstein's disappointment in the leadership of the LGBTQ community shocked many who read his essay in last week's Times of Israel blog posting. No one was prepared for the frank and honest assessment from one who was at the center of LGBTQ rights movement and the fight for equality. Yet, Goldstein speaks of his disdain for the many groups that lean into anti-Israel propaganda while at the same time, ignoring the violence perpetrated onto the LGBTQ community by Hamas and the Palestinians who live under their rule, among others. He pointed out that in the entire Middle East, Israel is the LGBTQ sanctuary of safety where all people are able to be themselves.

Those who heard Mr. Goldstein speak commented that he said what was on their mind for a long time, and how he was one of the best speakers we have ever had. I am attaching a link to Steven Goldstein's article below and urge you to read it. It will open your eyes to the level of antisemitism on both sides of the political arena, and how many of these organizations, whose leadership and founders were Jewish, have turned their back on the very people who created the organizations in the first place.

Let us pray with our actions to bring peace and understanding to the world we live in, and let it begin now.

I wish you and your families a wonderful summer and I look forward to seeing you all back in temple soon.




The 360 Circle of Tzedakah

Yay! Temple Isaiah's Book Discussion Group is coming back!

I am delighted to announce that our Book Group will be returning this fall.

Our first book will be The Wolf Hunt by Ayelet Gundar- Goshen, an Israeli author and psychologist who also wrote Waking Lions, which was one of our groups favorite previous books.

The Wolf Hunt features an Israeli family relocated to the Silicon Valley and is in significant part a focus on cultural differences and family dynamics, set in a mystery. Among other issues it asks "how well do you know your child?". It is also a timely portrayal of antisemitism and racism.

Every member of Temple Isaiah is invited whether they have participated in the past or not. We always have lively and thought provoking discussions which not only enhance our reading but create wonderful social interactions. I am hoping to hold this session in person, although our Zoom meetings have been successful as well. The setting and date will be announced closer to September. 
